

This is a qualifying event for the 2022 NZCF National Interschool Championship, to be held October 1st-2nd The winner will represent North Shore, Auckland, in the Primary division.

Please be aware that everybody in the playing hall MUST wear a mask.



Format: A 6-round swiss-system event for teams of four players (with optional reserve) from years 1-6 from the same school. Players should be ranked in order of playing strength; the order must be declared before the start of the event and must not change during the event. Furthermore, players in team A should be stronger than those in team B, and so on. Note that teams may be paired against another team from the same school.

Schedule: Teams need to sign in before 9:00am on the day of the tournament. A players' meeting will follow and we should start at about 9:15am. There will be a break for lunch and we aim to finish by 2:30pm. Digital chess clocks will be used; time control 15 minutes plus an increment of 5 seconds per move.

Adult Support: Visiting school teams must have an adult (teacher, parent, or guardian) present to supervise them. Teams which arrive without such a supervisor will not be allowed to take part. Teams whose supervisor leaves during the event will be removed from the pairings.

Entries: The entry fee of **\$60 per team** must be paid by the school to North Shore Chess Club before the event. All entries will be acknowledged and listed (in VegaTeam or Orion files) on the Interschool page on the website www.northshorechess.org.nz where you can find further information and a link to the Interschool Rules. An online registration page will also be provided; the link will be available via our website.

Information required: name of school; name and email address of the chess contact at the school; name and email address of the team captain (if different); number of teams entered; a list of the players in each team in order (Team A board 1, 2, 3, 4, reserve; Team B 1, 2, 3, 4, reserve, and so on). If your players have NZCF or FIDE IDs and ratings, then we would appreciate that information too.

Prizes: The first three teams will receive gold, silver, and bronze medals, which will be individually engraved with each player's name and sent, with certificates, to school Principals after the event, for presentation at Assembly. Those players who score 6/6 will also receive medals and certificates. If there is a trophy, it will be engraved and delivered to the winning school.

Qualifiers: If 20 or more teams compete, a second school will qualify; if 30 or more teams compete, a third school will qualify. Qualifiers will be determined by tiebreak if necessary.
